What is Title I?

Manchester High School is a school-wide Title I high school. This means that we receive federal funds to help all students become academically successful. Title I is designed to support schools in meeting challenging state academic standards and to reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students.

Manchester High School parent Involvement programs and family engagement workshops are based on improving student academic achievement and building parent capacity. As a Title I school, MHS will jointly develop with all parents/families a written parent involvement plan. Parents/families will also have the opportunity to review the school-wide plan and provide any suggestions.

2024 – 2025 Goals Manchester High School

- Manchester High School will obtain a 3% increase annually in the percentage of students scoring "DEVELOPING -or- Higher" on the 2025 Georgia End-of-Course Tests through the use of engaging, datadriven, rigorous, evidence-based instruction to meet the needs of all students.
- Increase the percentage of students in attendance for the 24-25 school year from 93.7% (23-24) to 94%.
- 3. Limit the number of repeat offenders (students with four or more discipline referrals) in each grade level for the 24-25 school year.
- 4. By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, there will be monthly professional development using the results from the MCSS needs assessment survey administered in May 2024.
- 5. Increase the percentage of students in grades 9-11 scoring "reading on grade level" (as measured by MAP growth measurement) from the Beginning of the Year 2024-2025 to the End of the Year.

2024 – 2025 Goals Meriwether County School System

- 1. Meriwether County Schools will obtain a 3% increase annually in the percentage of students scoring "DEVELOPING or- Higher" on the 2024 Georgia Milestones through the use of engaging, data-driven, rigorous, evidence-based instruction to meet the needs of all students.
- 2. Meriwether County Schools will establish positive school climates, increased collaboration, structured discipline processes, and provide support to attract and retain highly effective, growth-minded personnel committed to the success of each student and increase the overall retention rate by 10% annually.
- 3. By establishing a strong communication process and partnership plan, MCSS will increase the involvement of parents, families, and the community in the support, engagement, activities, and improvement of education for Meriwether County students by 30% by the 2024-2025 school year.
